

Key Data Points from Milliman Report

Inpatient MH/SUD* treatment occurs out-of-network
4 times more often than inpatient medical care.

Outpatient MH/SUD treatment is more than **5 times** as likely to be out-of-network than outpatient medical care.



New Hampshire

(one of the highest drug overdose rates)

Inpatient MH/SUD treatment:
10 times more likely to be out-of-network than inpatient medical care.



Utah

(suicide rate far above the national average)

Treatment in an outpatient facility:
nearly **20 times** more likely to be out-of-network than medical care in an outpatient facility.

*MH/SUD = Mental Health / Substance Use Disorder

Key Data Points from Milliman Report Cont.

Commercial Insurer Reimbursement Rates Vs. Medicare Reimbursement Rates

- Medical providers: paid between **11–15% more** than what Medicare pays.
- MH/SUD treatment providers: paid almost **5% less** than what Medicare pays.
- Primary care services for medical care: paid **21% more** than MH/SUD treatment services.
